State Proposition 98

EMINENT DOMAIN. LIMITS ON GOVERNMENT AUTHORITY. INITIATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

Bars state and local governments from taking or damaging private property for private uses. Prohibits rent control and similar measures. Eliminates deference to government in property rights cases. Changes condemnation rules

Fiscal Impact: Increased costs to many governments due to measure's restrictions. The net statewide fiscal effect, however, probably would not be significant.

State Proposition 99

EMINENT DOMAIN. LIMITS ON GOVERNMENT ACQUISITION OF OWNER-OCCUPIED RESIDENCE. INITIATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

Bars use of eminent domain to acquire an owner-occupied residence for conveyance to a private person or business entity. Creates exceptions for public works, public health and safety, and crime prevention.

Fiscal Impact: No significant fiscal impact on state or local governments.

Shall the ordinance The Utility User's Tax Modernization Act, adding Chapter 3.22 to the Winters Municipal Code and reducing the existing Utility User's Tax Rate from 5% to 4.75%, be enacted?
